City of Miles Miles Regular Council Meeting August 2, 2023 at 6:00 p.m.

Miles City Council met in regular session on August 2, 2023 at 6:00 p.m., at City Hall. PRESENT: N. Corlis, M. Leamy, N. Abernathy and D. Chrest. ABSENT: R. Lawrence. Mayor Daniel Ernst presided. Motion carried. Ayes 4, Nays 0.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: Council member N. Corlis made a motion to approve the agenda as presented, it was seconded by council member N. Abernathy. Motion carried. Ayes 4, Nays 0.

GUESTS: Warren Moeller, Amanda Dupont, and Paul Maze

Citizen/Public Comment - Warren Moeller approached the council with some concerns.

- 1. Warren is concerned that the Splash pad is going to flood his business with the water draining into the storm sewer. Paul and the council explained to Warren the splash pad water will not flood his business as it will drain into the sanitary sewer. With the research done for installing the splash pad there will be a 6" drain installed to handle the water flow.
- 2. Warren stated since the city is paying for the speed trailer why aren't they using it. Plus, the speed trailer needs to be placed down at his business because there's excess speed from the traffic coming from the south. Mayor explained the city don't pay for the speed trailer and furthermore the speed trailer needs repaired. Chief Miller explained to Warren why the speed trailer was placed by the Telephone Office. By placing the speed trailer by the Telephone Office it gives all traffic ample time to slow down.
- 3. Warren informed the council there is 10 business owners that don't live in Miles and would like the city to review the city Ordinance on garbage and contractual companies. He is going to speak to his legislator to consider changing the law where out of town business people can run for council. City contract with Republic ends in October 2024.
- 4. Warren has discovered there's too much chlorine in his water at his business. He would like the city to correct this issue. Council concluded Warren don't use enough water through the day, therefore he will need to run his water periodically during the day to solve this issue.

CONSENT AGENDA: Council member M. Leamy made a motion to approve the consent agenda, including the minutes of the previous meeting, paid, unpaid, financial statements, water, sewer, and maintenance reports, council member D. Chrest seconded the motion. Motion carried. Ayes 4, Nays 0.

NEW BUSINESS: Amanda Dupont from ECIA approached the council explaining her role as Coach for Keep Iowa Beautiful where the city is in a year one of the five. She stated in that year the city received the Derelict Building Grant of \$67,000.00 for the demolish of the building on Ferry Road, received \$3000.00 from the McDonough Foundation. She has just completed the Theisen's Grant. M. Leamy approached the subject with Amanda pertaining to a safety issue at the end of Hillcrest St. where a street light would help that situation, but with the bid from Alliant Energy to have the street light installed would cost the city 8731.00. Amanda thought there were a few grants the city could apply for to fund this project. Amanda also informed the council of the Rural Enrichment Grant is due at the end of the month. This grant requires a \$10,000.00 match from the city to show that the city has skin in the game. Clerk explained with collecting cans, lemonade stand, other donations, and the McDonough grant the city can provide that match. Amanda wanted to know if the council is pleased with outcome of ECIA/Keep Iowa Beautiful. Mayor and council complimented on the great job that EICA/Amanda is doing for the City of Miles.

Council member D. Chrest made a motion to approve 544 Adams Ave building permit, it was seconded by council member M. Leamy. Motion carried. Ayes 4, Nays 0.

Paul Maze informed the council the plastic fencing at the Miles Cemetery needs to be replaced due to vehicles damaging the fence while parking or turning into the cemetery. Paul is suggesting to metal fencing so in the event it gets hit by a car it won't damage as easy as the plastic fencing. Paul has talked to Josh Ellis (Keeney Welding) with a designed that will be comparable to the plastic fencing. Council agreed to bring this before the next council meeting.

Paul informed the council he met with John Mootz, Alliant Energy to determine the cost of installing the street light at the end of Hillcrest St. After reviewing the situation John Mootz came up the cost of \$8731.67 to install the street light. Council agreed to research for grants to paid for this project.

Council member M. Leamy made a motion to approve the 2nd Reading of Ordinance 2023-04, An Ordinance Amending Title VI, Physical Environment, Chapter 14, Building Permits of the City of Miles Code of Ordinance by Amending Section 6-14-8, 6-14-9, 6-14-10, and by adding Section 6-14-15 Special Requirements for Commercial Businesses, seconded by council member N. Abernathy. Motion carried. Ayes 4, Nays 0. Next council meeting is September 6, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. Brenda informed the council Cole from Commercial Recreational Specialist will be here to have a Splash Pad one on one to answers any questions or theories the residents may have.

ADJOURNMENT - Council member D. Chrest made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by council member N. Corlis. Meeting adjourned at 6:43 p.m. Motion carried. Ayes 4, Nays 0.
