MILES REGULAR MEETING FEBRUARY 7, 2024 AT 6:00 P.M. MILES CITY HALL

Mayor Pro-Tem Nancy Corlis called the regular session on February 7, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall. PRESENT: D. Chrest, N. Abernathy, N. Corlis, L. Horst, and B. Volquardsen.

GUESTS: Nate Voss, Kyle Driscoll, Olivia Abernathy, Kari White, Derek & Ashley Johnson, Carla Jochum, Josh Feldman and Amber, Brandon Meyer, Paul Maze, and Glenn Mommsen.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA – D. Chrest made a motion to approve the agenda as presented, it was seconded N. Abernathy. Motion carried. Ayes 5, Nays 0.

Citizen/Public Comments - Kari White.

Kari White, representing the Miles Telephone Co. approached the council explaining that Miles Telephone Co. is the second largest employer in town. And when there's an outage our office is open no matter of the weather conditions. Our employees come to work and need to be able to park on either side of the street. Kari expressed her concern that she's here to work together and try to resolve the parking issue during snow emergency. Maintenance employee, Paul Maze explained the city has a Snow Emergency Ordinance anything over 3", there is no parking on Ferry Road. And when you receive 22" of snow less than a weeks' time, it's hard to keep up with the snow, especially plowing around vehicles. Paul informed Kari the city has calendar parking and when the city receives over 3" he will work with the parking issue.

CONSENT AGENDA – N. Abernathy made a motion to approve the consent agenda, including the minutes of the previous meeting, paid, unpaid, financial statements, water, sewer, maintenance, police reports, B. Volquardsen seconded the motion. Motion carried. Ayes 5, Nays 0.

CLERK'S REPORT - Nothing at this time.

NEW BUSINESS – Mayor Pro-Tem N. Corlis informed the visitors the city received 5 letters of intent. Nancy asked if the candidates if they had any questions for the council. With nothing further, D. Chrest made a motion to appoint Derek Johnson as Mayor, L. Horst seconded the motion. Motion carried. Ayes 5, Nays 0.

Derek Johnson was sworn in by City Clerk, Brenda Tebbe.

Derek Johnson immediately took office.

L. Horst made a motion to approve obtaining appraisal of property necessary for condemnation process of acquiring temporary construction easement at 350 Ferry Road, D. Chrest seconded the motion. Motion carried. Ayes 5, Nays 0.

N. Corlis made a motion to approve setting a Public Hearing at FY2024-2025, Wednesday, April 3rd, 2024 at 6:00 p.m., seconded by B. Volquardsen. Motion carried. Ayes 5, Nays 0.

N. Abernathy made a motion to approve Payment #21 to Connolly Construction for the Wastewater Facility Project in the amount of \$13266.75, L. Horst seconded the motion. Motion carried. Ayes 5, Nays 0.

Up for discussion is the cost for the disinterment for a grave opening. Maintenance employee, Paul Maze informed the council he had received a quote for digging up a grave and explained with it being so time consuming it would be hard to put a cost on it when each situation would be different. After a brief discussion, L. Horst made a motion in case there's a disinterment the family member will be responsible to incur the cost, B. Volquardsen seconded the motion. Motion carried. Ayes 5, Nays 0.

Up for approval is a resolution for leasing a Kubota tractor through Kunau's. When city's enter into a lease agreement they are required to pass a resolution establishing the purpose of the lease. N. Corlis made a motion to approve Res. 2024-5, A Resolution approving to lease to own Kubota R640R3 Wheel loader, D. Chrest seconded the motion. Motion carried. Ayes 5 Nays 0.

Citizen Glenn Mommsen spoke up wanted to know why the city needed two tractors, and leasing a tractor is the worst option. Why don't the city save money and pay cash for the tractor. He stated why does the city need a new one, why don't you buy a slightly used tractor. Paul explained leasing was less than the interest rate at the bank. Paul informed Glenn we are trading in the current tractor we have to be more efficient in the day to day work, along with snow removal. Buying used can cause down time, and extra repair cost.

Paul informed the council he had a surprise visit from the DNR (on Wednesday) and while inspecting the wet well on Centennial Street (behind city hall) he discovered the grease and oil on top of the well. Paul indicated this has been ongoing problem, and city has contacted an attorney and has notified the owner that he needs to install a grease trap according to city ordinance. DNR findings will be forward on to the attorney.
